## Your Reasonable Service

The life of a believer in Christ is a life of service. It is a life of sacrifice. It is a life lived for the benefit of the other. Sadly, we as Christians often work against each other and not as a body of people working together with the gifts that God has blessed us with. We are to use these gifts for the sake of the kingdom and for the sake of the gospel of Christ. We are not to use them for personal gain or in a malicious way. The scripture reminds us constantly that we are to lay our lives down for the sake of the other. We are to walk in a new way, understanding ourselves as born again, renewed, and transformed in Christ.

The apostle Paul writes in Romans 12:1-8 *I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God. 3 For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith. 4 For as we have many members in one body, and all members have not the same office: 5 So we, being many, are one body in Christ, and every one members one of another. 6 Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, whether prophecy, let us prophesy according to the proportion of faith; 7 Or ministry, let us wait on our ministering: or he that teacheth, on teaching; 8 Or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, let him do it with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that sheweth mercy, with cheerfulness.*

We are instructed by Paul to live our lives differently than perhaps we had been living them. He says that this is your reasonable service, in other words understanding the mercy of God, the graciousness of God, and that we have been saved by His grace our lives should be lived in the same way. We are to be gracious people, offering grace unto the sinner. It is foolishness on our part to think that somehow we are entitled to this salvation, it is a gift

that we have received and we are called to remember this. We, the gentile people, have been grafted into the good olive tree (Romans ch.11), wild branches that we are. We are to remember from where we have come. We were strangers to the covenant of Abraham and had no right to the mercy of God. We, who were not the people of God have been made the people of God. O How marvelous is the mercy of God and how amazing is His Grace!

Our bodies then we offer to God as holy and acceptable, a sacrifice that's living, He has given us life. The ways of the world or the age we live in are not the rule and norm in our lives, but rather the ways of Jesus the Christ. He is the one who has given unto us a new existence. He is the one who indeed has transformed us by his work on our behalf. Our minds are to be stayed on Him and our actions are to emulate Him. This is what Paul means when he says not to think of ourselves more highly than we should, but rather according to the merits of Jesus the one who has transformed our minds. Paul says in Philippians 2:3-9 *3 Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves. 4 Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others. 5 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: 6 Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: 7 But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: 8 And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. 9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:*

The question that often arises is "How can I a sinner act and behave like Christ? The answer is found in the scripture. Jesus, when He told His disciples that He would be leaving them said in the gospel of John 14:12-18 *12 Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father. 13 And whatsoever ye shall ask in my name, that will I do, that*

*the Father may be glorified in the Son. 14 If ye shall ask any thing in my name, I will do it. 15 If ye love me, keep my commandments. 16 And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; 17 Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. 18 I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you.*

It is by the power of the Holy Spirit that we are able to act and behave in a Christ like manner. God in His mysterious and miraculous way empowers us by His Holy Spirit. He is gracious and gives us everything we need to carry out our ministry. We have all been redeemed, purchased by the blood of Christ. We are all called to minister or serve within the kingdom, which is the church of the saints. We are not rivals competing against each other. We are a body of believers with different gifts and abilities. So Paul says "Do what you are called to do according as God has given you the ability and grace to do so". Do this because "This is your reasonable service".

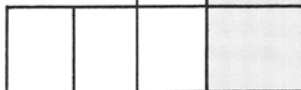
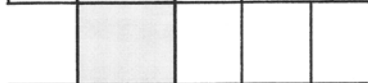
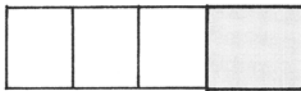
