The King of Kings!

“Put not your trust in princes, nor in the son of man in whom there is no help. His breath goeth forth, he returneth to his earth: in that very day his thoughts perish. Happy is he that hath the God of Jacob for his help, whose hope is in the Lord his God: Which made heaven, and earth, the sea, and all that therein is: which keepeth truth for ever” (Psalm 146:3-6).

We live in troubled times. We look for peace and security. We make alliances and treaties so we can live in peace and keep our security. We want job security, financial security, a comfortable standard of living and a good retirement with no worries. We have come to expect all these things and look to our country to provide these things for us. Most of us have not lived through really difficult times outwardly as our forefathers did and people in many parts of the world face even today. We have forgotten who is the ultimate provider of all of our blessings.

Grandpa's Reflections The Spring

Isaiah 58:11

"The LORD will guide you continually, And satisfy your soul in drought, and strengthen your bones; You shall be like a watered garden, And like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail"



They were driving towards town. Grandpa with three of the grandkids buckled into the back seat of his pickup truck. When the picture of a spring of water bubbling out of the ground entered grandpa's mind.

"Hey, you guys." Grandpa asked to the back seat. "Do any of you know what a 'spring' is?"

There was silence. Finally, the voice of the older grandkid said, "I think it's metal that you push on and it comes back."

"I know what the spring on the screen door looks like," middle grandkid said. "It's like a tube of wire that stretches and pulls the door shut."

"Great answers! And you are both completely correct," Grandpa answered. "But the kind of spring I'm talking about is a spring of water. Have you ever heard of a water spring?"

No voices answered as they drove toward town. "The Bible talks about 'springs of water' many times," Grandpa said. "I know a place along the road ahead that has a spring of water. You see God has made some places where the ground is so full of water that it comes rushing right out of the ground. No pumps, no windmills, just the water bubbling up. Usually water always runs down, but sometimes God make the water come up."

"Why haven't we ever seen a spring of water?" asked one of the backseat kids.

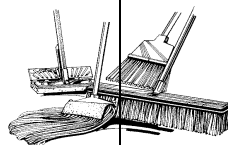

A church goer wrote a letter to the editor of a newspaper and complained that it made no sense to go to church every Sunday. "I've gone for 30 years now," he wrote, "and in that time I have heard something like 3,000 sermons. But for the life of me, I can't remember a one of them. So, I think I'm wasting my time and the pastors are wasting theirs by giving sermons at all."

This started a real controversy in the "Letters to the Editor" column, much to the delight of the editor. It went on for weeks until someone wrote this clincher:

"I've been married for 30 years now. In that time, my wife has cooked some 30,000 meals, but for the life of me, I cannot remember the menu of a single one of those meals. But I do know this...They all nourished me and gave me the strength I needed to do my work.
